3. Build schools' and parents' capacity for strong parent involvement as described in section 1118 (e).

In order to build a dynamic home-school partnership, Latexo High School with cooperation of the faculty, staff, parents, and students will provide the following:

- An annual meeting where parents will learn about the requirements of the school's Title I Program, and be given an opportunity to become involved with their child's education. The annual meeting will be held during the first semester. A letter will be sent to each child's parent, informing them of the date and time of the meeting.
- Parent meetings and conferences will be held at different times during the day to accommodate the needs of the parents. Communications with parents will be in a format and a language that they understand. Title I funds may be used to pay for reasonable and necessary expenses to enable parent to participate in school-related meetings and trainings.
- A description and explanation of the curriculum used, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, such as benchmarks and progress monitoring assessments, and proficiency levels students are expected to meet, will be provided to parents through a letter or conference.
- Assistance to parents in understanding the state's academic content standards, known as the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills and the state student achievement standards

based on the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR), will be communicated through the school-wide meetings and a letter from the principal.

- A school-parent compact designed by parents and school staff that outlines how parents, the entire campus staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improvement in student academic achievement.
- A minimum of one scheduled parent conference where the school-parent compact will be discussed as it relates to the progress of the student, as well as the expectations for the grade level school curriculum, test information, and any other concerns the teacher or parent may have.
- Parents will have the opportunity to help review, plan for and make suggestions to improve the Title I Program, as well as the Parental Involvement Policy and the School-Parent Compact.
- Appropriate parent participation opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to their child's education, if requested by the parent. Parents may request a meeting with the teachers or principal by phone, email, or in writing. In addition, parent may attend the scheduled yearly meetings.
- Information relating to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities will be sent to parents in a timely manner. Information will be given to parent through newsletters from the school, LISD and PTO Facebook Postings, School Messenger Call and Text Outs, PTO Meetings, and communication directly from the classroom teacher. In addition, the school marquees will be used to inform parents of dates of programs, meetings, and activities.
